China Visa Application and Information

Traveling to China requires a valid passport and visa. This document provides step-by-step instructions to help travelers obtain the appropriate visa for their trip.

1. Passport and Visa Requirements

- All travelers must hold a valid passport and visa to enter China.
- Travelers are individually responsible for securing these documents before departure.

2. If You Already Have a Valid Chinese Visa

- If you have a valid 10-year multiple-entry visa, you do not need to apply for a new one.
- If you've renewed your passport recently:
 - Bring your old passport (with the valid visa) and your current passport when entering China.

3. If You Do Not Have a Chinese Visa

Step 1: Determine Your Visa Type

- Apply for a non-business F visa (for academic and cultural exchange programs).
- The F visa typically allows double entry within 90 days.
- Do Not apply for an M visa. Your trip is to attend a conference and visit institutions.

Step 2: Obtain a Visa Support Letter from AASCU

- AASCU can provide an official letter to accompany your visa application.
- Email Sufei Li, AASCU's Assistant Director for China/Asia Programs, with the following information for each traveler:
 - o Full Name
 - Date of Birth
 - o Title

- Passport Number(s)

Step 3: Contact a Travel Agency or Visa Service Provider

- A travel agency can assist in preparing and submitting your visa application.
